### WELCOME TO SATA

Welcome to SATA - a research program funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) that recognizes the critical role the Arts can play in climate change action. This project is inspired by currents artists and organizations who are already working in the realm of sustainability and the arts (SATA). What makes this SATA Project unique is our focus on the scholarship and research surrounding SATA. Led by Ian Garret (York University), Tarah Wright (Dalhousie University), and supported by PhD Student Emma Bugg (Dalhousie University) and an Advisory Committee of 40+ SATA scholars and/or artists and/or practitioners, the SATA project's objectives are the following:

- · identify scholars, artists and practitioners working in SATA
- develop a working definition for Sustainability and the Arts Scholarship
- collect, analyze, and archive SATA scholarship



- collectively develop a comprehensive research strategy for scholars working in the burgeoning field of SATA
- promote new approaches for interdisciplinary SATA research
- cultivate collaborative partnerships and intellectual exchange among those engaged in SATA research

### Podcasts and Publications

We are happy to share relevant podcasts, publications, and other medias from our advisory council members (ACMs). This month's picks for SATA-related material are:

1. Claude Schryer's Conscient podcast: <u>Claude Schryer</u> has been hosting and producing <u>conscient podcast</u> since 2020 and now has published over 250 episodes (conversations, sound art, etc) about the ecological crisis with brilliant, passionate, and visionary artists and cultural workers.

The theme of the current 5th season is 'preparing for the end of the world as we know it and creating the conditions for other possible worlds to emerge'. Season 6, in January 2025 will be on 'art in time of crisis'.

2. <u>Creativity in climate adaptation: Conceptualizing the role of arts organizations</u> by E. Bugg, Dr. Wright, Dr. Zurba. This paper reports on interviews with key members of arts organization CreativePEI to better understand how cultural organizations can reimagine their role to better align with the evidence about what the arts can uniquely offer to climate action.

### Progress this far

#### Interviews & Database

With over half of the ACM interviews concluded, our data collection is underway. These conversations have allowed us to dive into the ways in which members of this team work, how they conceptualize our core concepts of sustainability, scholarship/research, and the arts, and to hear insights on barriers and opportunities that impact SATA work. We are so appreciative of the excellent conversations and insights that have been shared and are eager to continue connecting with you 1:1. These interviews are an important step towards understanding how those doing work at the intersection of the arts and environmental sustainability conceptualize their work. They will support our planning for next steps in the project, allowing us to build a process which aligns with the ACM's values and experience. If you haven't joined us for an interview yet, please reach out. Additionally, over 800 resources have been added to the project's Zotero database, in working efforts to create a comprehensive collection of SATA related scholarship - both academic and grey literature.





### Next steps for the Project

#### Subcommittees & Literature Review

Next steps for the project include the continuing interviews of SATA researchers and practitioners to better understand their conceptualizations of SATA and perceived drivers and barriers to SATA scholarship.

Subcommittee focuses follow:



 Data Analysis: Our next steps include continuing our methodological conversations and establishing an analysis plan for our interview data. We are soon ready to begin outreach to scholars/artists outside the ACM.

3. Inclusion: Denis Gupta and Ian met in early summer to discuss the project's approach to inclusion. A relational framework for critical discussion around inclusion as part of SATA's process - a "protocol structure" - for meetings Additionally, we are continuing to develop our database of SATA scholarship/research/grey literature, building out focus areas such as "cultural sustainability". This will be used to conduct a comprehensive literature review of current understandings of sustainability, the arts, and scholarship, leading to

the developing working definition of sustainability and the arts.
